THE GRAPEVINE AND RCA

In this booklet I set out to share with other collectors the information about the Grapevine Label I have built up over the last few years, and to produce a collectors guide to Grapevine releases over the last two years. The Grapevine label is, in my opinion, the most outstanding U.K. soul label of the last decade and has already surpassed Jay Boy, if not in the quantity then cetainly in the quality of releases. The material released has been outstanding and reflects the dedication to our music of both John Anderson, who established the label, and Richard Searling. While this booklet concentrates on the rarities produced by this label, I hope collectors will continue to buy ordinary copies as well as the collectors items, and give the label the support it deserves.

Also included in this booklet is a guide to Northern Soul releases on RCA, in both the U.K. and the U.S.A. While I could have extended this section to include disco-northern crossovers, eg. Vickie Sue Robinson and The Brothers, and soul releases in general, I did not want to produce a work of monumental proportions! I leave it to those who follow on to expand on this booklet, perhaps one day a complete RCA listing may be produced. For now, I believe this is the most comprehensive guide to a U.K. soul label still in operation ever produced, and I hope it answers any questions you may have about the Grapevine Label.

Goneral

The first release on Grapovine was GRF 100, RICHARD 'POPCORN' WYLIES "ROSEMARY WHAT HAPPENED", which was released 20th May 1977. The biggest seller to date is GRP 106, JUDY STREET'S "WHAT", with 40,250 plus copies sold.

GRP 122, THE TOMANCOES "I REALLY LOVE YOU", was withdrawn shortly after release, probably due to poor sound quality and mis-spelt group name (TAMANCOES on label). GRP 122 was never re-launched and, although listed as available in the current RCA Dealers Guide, is now deleted.

A popular belief is that the first twenty Grapevine releases are now deleted. In fact the following deletions were notified to dealers in May 1980, effective from 30th May 1980, and are the only Grapevine deletions so far (to 1st October 1980);

As everybody knows, the early Grapevine demos are plentiful, but later demos are harder to get hold of. This is due to RCA's policy, during 1979, of cutting back its mailing list in stages. At each stage Grapevine demos became harder to obtain. Also during '79 RCA ceased issuing it's reps with demo copies, so ending another source of Grapevine demos.

From January 1980, RCA dropped it's mailing list completely and ceased issuing actual 'demo' copies. Promotional copies from this time had large 'not for sale' stickers on the label or were in 'demo' sleeves (sometimes both), the exceptions to this being some disco subsidiary labels, mostly 12 inch releases. Therefore the last releases of 1979 (GRP 131, GRP 135, GRP 139 and CRP 144) are amongst the rarest demos.

RCA are still issuing promotional copies to their promotions manager, for distribution mainly to radio station D.J.'s, but they have made actual demo copies of the latest Grapevine release (RED 3, 7" and 12") which are by far the rarest demos to date.

Some demo copies of GRP 102 were sent out with a white and black 'not for sale' sticker over the centre (see front cover). While these are probably no marer than actual demo copies, they are an item which collectors may like to pick up on.

Demo copies were issued of both 12 inch releases (see listing below). Demo L.P's were issued, probably of all three L.P's but I have only seen the last two. They have a gold stamp on the cover (Demonstration sample, not for sale), but the actual label is no different from ordinary copies. As far as I can establish, all three L.P's are still available.

ACETATES (see top three illustrations, back cover.)

The information I have on the issuing of acetates is very sketchy, but I feel this deserves it's own section as these will become very collectable in the future.

The first acetates appeared early on in the life of the label (probably around June 1978). They were of previously unreleased Detroit material, e.g. BETTY BOO'S "SPELLBOUND" and 'POPCORN' WLIE'S "HANKY PANKY", and were in 10 inch form. They went out to the top 'Northern' D.J's and there were probably no more than five copies of each.

From this point until January 1980 acetates, in both 10" and 7" form, of various Grapevine releases went to the top 'Northern' D.J.'s. Again, the quantity of each probably did not exceed single figures. The one exception to this was the Del Capris 10 inch acetate. A number of these, 50 to 100, were manufactured and were distributed by promotions managers and reps to help promote the record.

From January 1980 I have not been able to establish the distribution of acetates. It appears that Grapevine undertook their own promotion, both within RCA and within the 'Northern' scene, so the quantity pressed of each acetate probably increased.

RCA Int. Illl Various Artists "Funky Bottom Congregation". Compiled by Dave McAleer and released in 1969, this was a cheap budget release at that time. It contains the first U.K. release of Herb Ward's 'Honest to Coodness' and other classic tracks by The Exciters, Jimmy Radcliffe, Willie Hutch and others Well worth picking up.

Probably well known to those people that have been on the 'Northern' scene for some years but maybe not as well known to newcomers. This 1976 Richard Searling compilation has then all; Beverly Ann, Judy Freeman, Lorrainne Chandler etc, plus superbly comprehensive sleeve notes by Richard. It will probably have been put out in the reduced racks long ago, but one worth checking your local record store for.
